General Race Information:

- Organised in accordance with the rules and regulations of ASA and
- Starting time for the 25km is 6h00, followed by the 10km at 07h00 and the 5km at 07h15.
- The 25km and 10km is an EPA Participation League Race.
- 4. Minimum age for 25km is 16 years, minimum age for 10km is 14 years on race day and the minumum age for the 5km is 9 years old.
- 5. Children on 5km to be accompanied by an adult.
- 6. Water will be available along the route.
- 7. Athletes must run in official club colour with the 2024 Licence numbers on the front and back of the vest.
- 8. Athletes who are not licensed members of a club affiliated to ASA must purchase a temporary license to be worn on the front of vest on plain colour T-shirt.
- 9. Temporary licensed athletes are not covered by ASA Group Insurance which is only available to members of athletics clubs.
- 10. Age category tags must be worn on front and back of your vest if you wish to qualify for category prizes. Athletes may be requested to provide proof of age on race day.
- 11. The race committee reserves the right to accept or reject any entry.
- 12. The Prize Giving will commence at 09h30, athletes must be present for lucky draw. No Prize money for 5km but you will qualify for lucky draw prizes. Cut off time for all runs is 09h45.
- 13. Manual entries/ School/ Bulk pre-entries must be handed in by 16h00 on Wednesday, 06th March 2024.
- 14. Enter online on www.webtickets.co.za or manual entries may be handed in at Brian Bands in Cape Road, Sportsmans Warehouse in Moffet Retail Park and UD Sports in Uitenhage (cash only for manual entry payments). The closing date for online and manual pre-entries is on Wednesday, 6th March by 16h00.
- 15. Collection of race number (pre-entries and late entries) will be available on Friday 8 March 2024 between 16h00 and 18h00 from the Westbourne Oval, and from 05:00 at Lake Farm Centre on race day. Entry fees are non-refundable.
- 16. The no seconding rule will apply. No private vehicles will be allowed on the route to second athletes.
- 17. Anti-Littering rule apply. Refuse bins will be provided along the route. Please discard used water sachets into or near to these bins.
- **18.** Wearing of earphones are not allowed and may lead to disqualification.
- 19. Please be mindful of the athletes on the route when arriving to the start of the race.

The annual Lake Farm 25km training run was traditionally placed on the calendar to accommodate the Two Oceans Ultra athletes to do a good training run.



Rolf Kordes, an esteemed Duathlon athlete. Ironman. Comrades and Two Oceans athlete, used this event and this route for most of his training runs.

Rolf, now 83, together with many of the great athletes of his generation, is no longer able to compete and it was decided to honor them by becoming involved with the Lake Farm Charity Run.

Very few people are aware of the impact that illness such as Dimentia and Alzheimers have on the person that has been diagnosed, nor the family members of those patients, and therefore, by honoring our athletes that are in their golden years, whether affected by these illnesses or not, it is a great opportunity to bring awareness to the athletics fraternity.

The difference between Dementia and Alzheimer's Disease is that Dementia is a general term for a decline in mental ability severe enough to interfere with daily life, while Alzheimer's is a specific disease. Alzheimer's is the most common cause of dementia.

Dementia is a term for several diseases that affect memory, thinking, and the ability to perform daily activities. The illness gets worse over time. It mainly affects older people but not all people will get it as they age.

Dementia is a progressive, irreversible clinical syndrome. Dementia mainly affects older people, and after the age of 65, the likelihood of developing dementia roughly doubles every five years and affects an estimated 1 in 14 people over the age of 65 and 1 in every 6 people over the age of 80.
